More intellectual growth occurs in the first three years of life than at any other time. Infants and toddlers absorb information every minute of the day. They do this by chewing and tasting, listening, babbling, and eventually producing words.

We choose a variety of activities that stimulate learning in our toddlers through exploration and discovery. Many of the best learning activities can happen during daily routines when it is fun and enjoyable. Some of our activities are chosen to develop language and motor skills, while others provide opportunities for fingerplay, or outdoor play.

Infants -- Listening to music, looking in a mirror, tracking an object, crawling through an obstacle course, finding a hidden object, feeling different textures, playing age appropriate musical instruments, looking at board books together.

Toddlers -- Exploring colors through matching games and art, learning simple songs, dancing or moving to music, taking objects in and out of containers, listening to short books, discovery bottles, texture exploration, building with blocks, and more.
